REPORT OF THE 24th EACO ASSEMBLY OF BROADCASTING OPERATORS HELD AT SILVER SPRINGS, BUGOLOBI, KAMPALA – UGANDA, FROM 26th – 27th JULY 2017.

1.0. OPENING OF THE MEETING

The 24th Assembly of Broadcasting Operators of EACO was held at Silver Springs Bugolobi, Kampala Uganda from 26th to 27th July 2017. The Chairman, Mr. Meddy Kaggwa (Uganda) who welcomed members present to the 24th Assembly of Broadcasters of EACO, opened the meeting.

The meeting was attended by members from the EACO Secretariat, Broadcasting Operators and National Regulatory bodies of the EACO members, namely Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda. Apologies were registered from Tanzania and Burundi.

Noted 3; WRC-19 Preparations	EACO has commenced its preparatory work for the World Radio Conference scheduled to take place in 2019. Progress report is provided in the full WG11 report.
Noted 4: <i>Membership</i>	The EACO Secretariat is continuously currying out membership campaigns. However, majority of broadcasters and operators are yet to participate in EACO.
Challenges;	 The following concerns were noted; Affordability and Availability of STBs and integrated digital TV receivers. Insufficient local content Poor Quality of Service and Quality of Experience. Escalating piracy and copyright issues.
Agreed 01	 a. Regulators should encourage all Private and Public broadcasters to form associations in member countries, which will advocate and represent them in EACO. b. The EACO Secretariat send invitations to individual broadcast operators. c. The Secretariat should arrange regular meetings to improve on impact of EACO.

Noted 01	The WG 11 developed a harmonized spectrum policy guideline, to be
	considered as reference by EAC member states.
Noted 02	The 23rd EACO Regulatory Assembly held in Kigali/Rwanda in June 2016 approved the guidelines on TV White Space deployment within EACO region.
	For the second cycle, the WG 11 agreed to update the document by including the guidelines on development of TV White Space database.
Noted 03	The WG 11 developed the mechanism for cross border coordination for specific services.
	Due to the existence of forced roaming in some places around boarder areas, the WG 11 also developed a separate framework for frequency cross border coordination for mobile services.
Noted 04	The WG 11 has developed the EACO informative report on licensing of the digital dividend spectrum for broadband services.
Noted 05	WG 11 developed the strategies for implementation of the outcomes of the

	WRC-15. The WG 11 has also established the structure of preparation of WRC 19, with Burundi as the coordinator of all WRC-19 preparatory activities within the EAC.
