

REPORT OF THE 27TH EACO POSTAL ASSEMBLY HELD ON 7TH JULY, 2021

1.0 Introduction

The East African Communications Organisation (EACO) held virtually its Postal Assembly meeting on 7th July, 2021. The meeting had participants from Postal Corporation of Kenya (PCK), Communications Authority of Kenya (CA), Uganda Post Ltd (UPL), Uganda Communications Commission (UCC), Tanzania Posts Corporation (TPC), Rwanda Utilities Regulatory Authority (RURA), National Post Office of Rwanda, the Universal Postal Union (UPU) Regional Coordinator in Southern and East African English-speaking countries, and Representatives of SAPOA participated in the meeting.

2.0 Opening of the meeting

The meeting was opened by the outgoing Chairman of EACO Postal Assembly Mr. Elia Madulesi, Tanzania Post Corporation (TPC).

He thanked members on the work done since the previous meeting in July 2019, in Mwanza, Tanzania, during which he was elected Chair of the Assembly.

9.0 Discussion and Way forward for the Postal Assembly

Through the discussion both workshop on e-commerce in postal sector and the WG4 reports, recommendations have been made, and crosscutting issues identified.

9.1 Recommendations

- a. Consider ecommerce as a new era of opportunity
- b. Postal organisations need to invest in human resource, new technology in order to benefit from the e-commerce.
- c. Consider putting in place prerequisites that would enable a real participation in cross-border ecommerce such as supporting regulatory framework, electronic payment...
- d. Accelerate implementation of digital solutions.
- e. Measure Quality of Service improvement: We must review processes towards improvement of customer services through regular customer satisfaction surveys.
- f. Develop interactive websites where customer information, complaints and compliments are received and responded to.
- g. Continue the process of Implementation of a harmonized national addressing and postcodes systems in East African region
- h. Implement Digital National Addressing, which is paramount as this opens up space for Postal Operators and Couriers to deliver the last mile delivery efficiently and effectively. Countries will consider exploring the alternative solution on addressing such as "Patented Digital Coding Technology" proposed by GRIDCODE Technology, which looks smarter, effective and efficient (less time and resource consuming).
- i. Encourage infrastructure sharing by promoting partnership.
- j. Consider capacity building as key element to the growth of the sector.
- k. Consider training for postal sector staff in emerging technologies to ensure that the sector is always ready for to be part of the digital economy.
- I. WG4 Members to regularly attend WG meetings.

9.2 Consideration of cross-cutting issues for submission to the Joint Committee

It was agreed that the following cross – cutting issues be forwarded to the Joint Committee:

- i. Put in place ecommerce policies, laws and regulatory frameworks to provide an enabling environment for ecommerce development.
- ii. Implementation of Harmonized national addressing system in EAC Region

- b. Noted and adopted the progress report of WG4 on Courier Service Development and Regulation.
