INTRODUCTION

What is EACO?

The East African Communications Organization (EACO) is a regional organization that brings together national ICT regulators, operators, services providers (in the telecommunication, broadcasting and postal sub-sectors) ICT training institutions and other stakeholders in the communication sector within Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania and Uganda.

The broad objective of EACO which was established in 2000 is to strengthen and promote cooperation among the five EAC Countries in the development and provision of postal, telecommunication and broadcasting services in East Africa and Headquartered in Kigali, Rwanda.

EACO has several Working Groups (WG). One of which is WG5 on IP Networks, Standards, and Cybersecurity which aims to "Develop strategies towards keeping regional Internet traffic local within East Africa". This concept note focuses on ToR item #7 which aims to keep local Internet traffic within the East African region.


Problem Statement

For several years, the idea of interconnecting the Internet eXchange Points was considered the best solution for keeping local Internet within the East African region. However, this idea ultimately proved unworkable for both technical and economic reasons. After many meetings and consultations, WG5 came to the conclusion that the best approach would be best to establish a forum aimed at enabling growth in the regional peering and interconnection ecosystem through regular dialogue with Internet exchange point operators, Internet service providers, content providers, policy makers, and other key industry stakeholders.

OBJECTIVES OF THE FORUM

- 1. To bring together all the players and stakeholders of the Peering and Interconnection ecosystem. This includes but is not limited to:
 - a. Internet Service Providers,
 - b. Content Service Providers.
 - c. Datacentre Service Providers,
 - d. Hosting Service Providers,
 - e. Regulatory Institutions,
 - f. Policy makers
 - g. Academia, educational institutions
 - h. etc.
- 2. To facilitate dialogue and interaction amongst and between the stakeholders to address the peering at inter-connection opportunities and challenges in the EA region.
- 3. To promote peering and inter-connection best practices in the EA region.
